



- Deal struck to save Ivy Lodge:

2009-CRISER ROAD

- Cooperative venture: land from the School Board; public/private partnerships; community leaders and organzations; volunteers
- Used connections to tap into relationships built over decades: the result is the facility we have today
- 2011--County buys Villa Ave. \$550k, included debt forgiveness of \$231k=property worth \$2.1 million
- Look at the >\$1.2 million on donor wall
